Homework: Homework will be assigned daily and is due each Monday. We will select 5-10 problems to grade. The lowest homework score will be dropped in determining the homework average.

Exams: There will be 3 regular exams scheduled form 9/24, 10/29, and 11/27. The lowest of these will be dropped. There are no makeup exams so if you miss an exam, that grade will be dropped and you won't receive a grade of 0. Exam questions are based on, but not limited to, the homework problems and examples in lecture. The final exam will be comprehensive, including material from the entire course.

Attendance: Attendance is required. Class participation will be an essential part of this course. Students' final grades in the class go down by a letter grade if they miss more than 5 classes. This policy is in effect because students who miss more than 5 classes almost never pass the class, so attendance is crucial to your success.
