**Quizzes:** A series of short quizzes will be based on class discussions, readings, and homework and will be used to prepare students for the exam. The quizzes may be in class or at times take home.

**Exams:** Exam questions will be based on class discussions, readings, and homework. There may be a take home portion.

Attendance: Attendance is required. Class participation will be an essential part of this course. Unlike most math classes this course is not meant to be a lecture class. Students will play a large role in determining the direction the course goes through their questions, comments, and suggestions. Students' final grades in the class go down if they miss more than three classes. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANYTHING SAID IN CLASS, AND THIS MAY INCLUDE CHANGES TO THE SYLLABUS (an extra exam might be added or the dates might be changed, for example), so if you do have to miss class be certain that you find out what happened in class that day.
