I saw...one who was ancient of days...his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool – Daniel 7:9

[Mark 16:1-8, garden tomb, Sunday] When the Sabbath was past, while it was still dark, behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from the sky, and came and rolled away the stone from the door, and

sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him, the guards shook, and became like dead men. Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, that they might come and anoint him. Very early on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. They were saying among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" for it was very big. Looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back. Mary Magdalene ran and came to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have laid him!"
