How Not To Cheat on Your Assignments

You may not:

- Copy any or all of the homework from anyone else.
- Look at pre-written solutions to any of the homework problems from any source.
- Try to get the TA, or Math Center tutors to tell you the answer or write out part or all of the solutions to any assigned homework problem.
- Use a calculator, computer algebra system, or website to do computations unless explicitly permitted by the problem statement.
- Request online assistance with a homework problem, unless you have been granted permission in advance by the instructor.
- Request online assistance with an exam problem.

You May:

- Talk to your fellow students about the homework. You are welcome, indeed encouraged, to collaborate and share ideas about how to do the homework.
- Ask Dr. Rouse or the TA for guidance about the concepts behind the homework.
- Ask Dr. Rouse or the TA to work a similar problem to the problem the student is struggling with. (This may be difficult sometimes with abstract questions.)
- Ask Dr. Rouse or the TA to provide a hint in the event that you get stuck.
- Ask Dr. Rouse or the TA to look over a write-up of a problem to assess if there are any issues.
- Compare your work with other students *after* you have done the problem, for example to see if you got the same answer to a calculation problem.
- Request permission to seek online assistance with homework problems.
